Dear Ecole Joe Clark Families,

What a great day at EJCS! Students and staff at Joe Clark set a goal to get 100 Bronco Tickets to earn a fun school wide activity. We worked hard in November, to earn Flash Light Buddy Reading and it was so fun! Nice to see our older students leading the younger ones and helping them to read. In case you aren't sure what a Bronco Ticket is... As a staff we have decided there was a need for a common approach to supporting positive student behavior at Joe Clark School. We are focusing on four concepts: Respect for Self, Respect for Others, Respect for Learning and Respect for Property. We are recognizing students who have shown leadership and respect in a variety of different ways. Some of the notable ways we have shown respect this month include:

- Taking turns on the playground, even when we want to be first!
- Showing kindness and caring towards a classmate
- Helping a student from another classroom fill their water bottle.
- Showing self-control in the classroom, hallways and at recess
- Picking up garbage or a mess when they happen
- Modelling good behavior for others and following classroom expectations
- Solving problems by talking through them rather than getting physical

These are only just a few of the ways students have stepped up! We also have some of our older students helping to identify students who are going above and beyond to make Joe Clark a great place to be! Each week, we draw from our Bronco Tickets, and share a picture of the Broncos of the Week in our daily morning announcements. At the end of each month, we will give out Bronco Stuffies to a few students who consistently showed up as leaders in our school!

Our approach also includes referrals from staff for students who need more support with showing respect and caring to others. We deal with those referrals on a case-by-case basis and support students to reach their potential by building skills they may be struggling with. Our administration team follows up each day with students who may need support. This may look like a conversation with our students, spending some time planning to address behavior, or providing a place for them to work out an issue with a peer. In some cases, parent contact is also made if the behavior is repetitive or physical in nature.

This month, we had 133 Bronco Respect Tickets given out, and only 13 behavior referrals! This new procedure supports <u>FSD Student Code of Conduct and Progressive Discipline</u> <u>Policy</u>. Each month we will set a new goal, and work towards a new school wide activity.
