February is Black History Month

<u>Black History Month</u> in Canada celebrates the achievements, contributions, and history of Black Canadians, and recognizes and honors the significant impact that Black Canadians have had on the country's history and culture, acknowledging their struggles, accomplishments, and ongoing contributions to various fields. The origins of Black History Month can be traced back to the United States, where it was first celebrated in February in honor of the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, two individuals who played key roles in African American history. In Canada, the celebration began in the 1950s and 1960s, with the efforts of individuals and organizations seeking to highlight the history of Black Canadians. During Black History Month, various events, activities, and educational initiatives take place across Canada to promote awareness and understanding of Black history and culture. It also serves as a reminder of the ongoing importance of fostering inclusivity, understanding, and appreciation for the diverse contributions of all Canadians.

Early Childhood Intervention Program (Ages 0-5)

Offers navigation, education and support for families concerned with their child's development and/or children at risk for developmental delays (premature birth, prenatal exposure to drugs or alcohol, eating difficulties, diagnosed disability). They are based in Calgary but will service Okotoks and outlying areas. Families must be willing to travel into Calgary for some services. This is a free service. Service Access: Parents can self-refer. Healthcare providers and services, teachers, agencies, and public health nurses can refer but need permission from family first.
