Hello Joe Clark Families,

Foothills School Division has adopted a standardized approach to sharing class lists for the upcoming school year. Due to the many changes that can occur over the summer—such as students moving in or out—these lists often require adjustments. To ensure accuracy and fairness, class lists for all schools in the division, including Joe Clark School, will be released in **late August**.

We understand this is a change from previous years at Joe Clark, and we kindly ask for your patience and understanding as we follow this new process.

School Supply Lists for the 2025–2026 school year have also been **standardized and simplified** to make things easier and more affordable for families. This year, there will be:

- One list for Junior Kindergarten (JK) students
- One list for **Kindergarten students**
- One list for Grade 1-2 students
- One list for **Grade 3–5 students**

These lists are now available on the Joe Clark website: ÉJCS Student School Supply Lists 2025/26. If your child is in a combined-grade classroom (e.g., Grade 2/3), please use the list that corresponds to your child's specific grade (e.g., Grade 2).

Families may choose to purchase supplies independently or order through the School Start Program for home delivery. We've worked to keep supply lists consistent in both content and cost, and you will be able to purchase supplies at a time that is convenient for you, rather than waiting for class lists to be released.

We are also incredibly grateful to our **School Council**, who has generously provided some of the more expensive and specific items. This ensures that every student has access to the materials they need for a successful school year.

Over the next few weeks, teachers will work to create balanced class lists that consider friendships, class sizes, and individual learning needs. While we do not take specific classroom placement requests, if you feel there is important information that should be considered, you are welcome to share it with your child's current teacher for consideration. You may notice some combined-grade classrooms again next year—this is not new to Joe Clark. These classrooms offer many benefits, including opportunities for leadership, multi-age collaboration, and co-planned curriculum that enhances learning through cross-grade activities. We hope you enjoy a restful and fun summer. Please be assured that your child will have a wonderful year ahead, with a great teacher and supportive classmates.

Please note that the area in front of the school on the **west side** is designated strictly for **Foothills School Division buses and emergency vehicles**. This is **not** a **drop-off or pick-up zone** for students or families. Keeping this area clear is essential for student safety and is a requirement set by the **Town of High River and FSD Transportation Services**, not by Joe Clark School staff.

Crosswalks and Patrollers:
