- 3. Write your recipe! (IN STUDENTS' OWN WORDS & MEMORIES!!!) Kids should write out their favorite recipe to share with the class. It can be any meal, entrée, side, snack, appetizer, or dessert. These turn out the best when the kids do the steps 100% by themselves. It may come out "Turn oven on to 100 degrees" but let them the recipes are even cuter when they're fully grown and looking back.
