System-Based Delegations \& Presentations:
- Big Rock School shared their education plan on March 27th.
- Kevin Gushulak (Director of Facility Services) gave an update and reported on the improvements that will have been completed by the end of this year and what is planned for the upcoming year.
- Charity Tegler (Divisional Indigenous Learning Coordinator) gave an update on the work she is leading within schools to advance First Nations, Metis, and Inuit student success. It was exciting to see the improvement Grade 2-9 students have made academically throughout our division this past year.
- N.B. The common theme and focus of Engagement-Support-Success found in the school division's 5-year Education Plan was evident and celebrated in each of the presentations made to the Board.
Information / Discussion Items:
- The Division's Capital Plan was presented and approved on March 27th. Included in the plan are the Capital Plan Priorities for 2024 through to 2026.
- The Board approved a recommendation by the Awards Committee to nominate the KIDS Only Shoppe at the Millarville Market for the work they do to support our kids and our greater FSD community.
- Administrative Procedures are designed to operationalize Board policies. APs 140, 213, 350, and 155 were reviewed during the two Board meetings in January.
- An FSD advocacy document was shared with the Board that outlines the division's concerns regarding proposed changes being made to the Local Authority Elections Act that would have ballots list political affiliations alongside each nominee's name on municipal election ballots.
- Drew Chipman - Assistant Superintendent of Corporate Services - shared a preliminary budget update for 2024-2025 with the Board at the April 10th meeting. The Division meets with AB Education on Friday, April 12th, to ask them to work with us to help address the challenges we face due to our system's enrollment growth issues and other funding challenges. Board decisions regarding the new budget will be pending until after the April 12th meeting with the province.


## Board Committee Reports:

- On the morning of the April 10th Board meeting, the Board engaged in its annual self-evaluation as a follow-up to the work they have been engaged in relating to their newly formed Governance Quality Standards and the work they have been doing around "systemness".

- Congratulations to FSD's Council of School Councils (COSC) who were awarded the "2024 ASCA Division School Council Engagement Award" for their advocacy work with local MLAs.
- Congratulations to Spitzee School Council who received the "2024 ASCA Excellence in Learning Partnerships Award" for the work they and the community did to build their new community/school playground. Special thanks goes to members of the Bennington family who prepared and submitted this nomination to ASCA.
- Congratulations to Sierra Havinga - a first year teacher from Ecole Okotoks Junior High School. She is this year's FSD representative for the Edwin Parr Award in Zone 5.
