In addition to learning about Impulse Control and Response Inhibition, these days at Spitzee...

- <u>Kindergarten</u> students are practicing their writing: holding thoughts in their minds, sounding out words, including finger spaces. They are sorting 2D shapes and 3D objects. They are looking at sets of objects and wondering, "How many more to get to 10?"
- Grade 1 students have been building a community answering the question: How does a community work together to meet the needs of everyone? They have been working on longer

- words using the suffixes /s/, /es/,/ed/, /ing/ and using syllables to write longer words. In math, they continue to work on story problems using addition and subtraction.
- Grade 2 students are learning about Fairy Tales and Earth systems, using vocabulary such as
 "interactions" and "relationships". Students presented their musical instruments to wrap up the
 Sound Energy Unit. Congratulations to the Gr 2's for their great work on home reading. Math –
 Reviewing addition and subtraction strategies.
- <u>Grade 3</u> students will connect previous learning of punctuation, proper sentences, labelling for clarity and clearly sharing their understanding with some new creative tasks! Students will focus on finding missing numbers in equations and growing their understanding of what equal means! In Science, 3's are learning how does the ability to change matter affect our quality of life? In Social Studies we will discuss the parts of a culture and learn how to develop an informative and creative infographic
- Grade 4 Students are applying their understanding of non-contact forces in science to design and build toys and games. They will be doing procedural writing to create rules or instructions for their toys/games. They also got to make smoothies with the help of Mrs. Neighbor to learn about healthy food choices. They created their ultimate kid smoothie in art using cutouts from the different grocery store flyers and will be doing a write up to describe how to make their ultimate smoothie. Nature journaling we have been spending one afternoon a week with Mrs. Calabrese as part of our Science, Language arts and art learning to do nature journaling out in the forest areas west of the school. Students have learned to listen and notice and represent what they notice or wonder in visual ways. We have had lots of questions come out of our trips and the class has extended their learning beyond our time outside to learn more about the living systems in our area. In Math they are doing order of operations and balancing equations
- <u>Grade 5</u> is focusing on Weather and Climate in Science, Indigenous Peoples of Canada and ancient civilizations in Social Studies, subtraction and addition with money and Novel Studies (both as small groups and "Underground to Canada" as a large group) in LA.
