- AP Update: AP 153 (advertising and distribution of materials), AP 163 (alcohol and drugs), AP 491 (volunteers), AP 110 (school councils), AP 157 (flag protocol), AP 375 (graduation exercises), AP 231 (home education), AP 230 (flexible learning programming), AP 167 (emergency health issues), AP 316 (administration of medication), AP 130 (organization of school year), AP 260 (field trips and student exchanges), AP 540 (school facility capital planning)
- The Board met with High River's MLA Chelsae Petrovic on Jan 23rd. Senator Riley is at the top of FSD's modernization requests and a tour of that school by the MLA is being set up by admin.
- The revised calendar for 2025-26 was presented and approved by the Board.
- The impact of pending US tariffs on provincial funding was discussed with a wait and see approach being taken by senior admin and the Board.

Board Committee Responsibilities and Reports

- The Board was involved in its own professional development session again in January focusing on tying up loose ends regarding programming and resources that are tied to governance issues.
- Three of our trustees attended an online PD session on strategies when advocating to the provincial government for programming and operational support.

<u>Divisional / Ward 5 Highlights and Initiatives</u>

- Ecole Senator Riley Middle School is currently at the top of the division's school modernization list.
- 42 art pieces created by Highwood's Holocaust Studies students were on display at the Calgary Central Library in January as part of "Art and the Holocaust" sponsored by the Calgary Jewish Federation.
- Two High River schools Senator Riley and Highwood -- received funding for special projects from the Friends of Foothills Schools Foundation.

Learning Update- Denise Saunderson Grade 1

Denise gave a quick presentation to the council, admin, trustee and parents about the recent conference she had attended about reading. Reading can look different for everyone, it is a multi layered process. Denise discussed the importance of building phonetic awareness with her students and demonstrated and discussed some of the activities she uses in her classroom.

- We participated in a demonstration of "Map It", a reading, phonetic activity that maps the words with sounds to the letters.
- Other techniques discussed were Boom/Clap/Swipe, "Chopping" words (ch-a-t)
