- The common theme and focus of Engagement-Support-Success found in the school division's 5-year Education Plan was evident and celebrated in each of the presentations.
Information / Discussion Items:
- Administrative Procedures are designed to operationalize Board policies. APs $224,250,430,417$, and 309 were reviewed during the two Board meetings in January.
- The Policy Review Committee met on February 15, 2024, to review the Appendixes of Policy 2 -Role of the Board, ensuring the most 'up to date' documents are located on the Division website as the Board moves closer to its first evaluation using the new Board of Trustee Governance Quality Standards. - The Board met with CTR on Feb. 29th to discuss areas of concern, cooperation, and celebration.
- The provincial budget was announced on March 1st and the determination of the implications and impact to the division are pending further study and investigation.
- The new high school has moved to the design stage of funding in the March 1st budget.
- A short six question survey related to Policy 14: A Place for All was sent out to school council chairs. Due to a minimal response, the deadline has been
extended until Easter Break. Please complete this so that your voice is heard re: admin procedures related to the policy.
Board Committee Reports:
- The Board continued its work on Governance Learning relating to its focus on the importance of "system-ness" and how that is demonstrated and implemented within Foothills S.D.
- The Policy Review Committee met and, in consultation with Caroline Roberts, have set in motion the use of AERR and the division's parallel survey to help guide budget decisions based on identified needs and areas for growth as a result of these two surveys.
- Trustee Irwin and Evans attended the Alberta Rural Education Symposium in Edmonton.
Division Highlights:
- In February and March, the Board conducted local tours of the four High River schools in addition to Highwood's two rural feeder schools - Cayley and Blackie.

Admin report- Mrs. Culbert/Mr. Holmes (10 minutes 5 minutes discussion and questions)
Engagement/Continuous Improvement:

- Our younger students are reading decodable readers, blending sounds
- They are creating/finding patterns and exploring lines of symmetry in math
- Students are focusing on cause and effect and making scientific connections in reading
- They are learning about the festivals in Iqaluit, including throat singing and traditional Inuit food
- Students are ranking the most important items in space and are recording sunrise and sunset times
- They are practicing to have quick recall of $6 x, 7 x$, and $8 x$ facts (and their related division facts)
- Using "The Day the Crayons Quit" as a model, they are using their creativity and expressive vocabulary as they pattern their writing to create "The Days the Teachers Quit"
- Our Grade 5 students enjoyed a great day of skiing at Castle Mountain last Friday
- We are hearing great feedback from students about the Two Schools One Book "Stuart Little"
- 10 new IPADs have arrived so that we can start to use them again in Gr 1 \& K groupings.


## Support:

- Classes are continuing to be engaged in place-based learning
- Literacy \& Numeracy interventions have begun for some students
- We hired 1.5 new EAs through Jordan's Principle funding; they have both been with us for a few weeks now
- Teachers are signing up to work with our Learning Coach to further develop their classroom support plans
- We have two student teachers, 1 in grade 5 and one in grade 3
- Our Family School Liaison Counselor is teaching Mind Up in grade 5 and, coming soon, grade 4
