Success: Advancing First Nations, Metis, and Inuit student success – enhance the application of foundational knowledge, support cultural learning and accurate depiction of Indigenous worldviews.

- Kindergarten students are TEACHING their classmates how to draw themselves, mallards, bunnies, and mermaids! They have also been doing really well at the pool last week and this week!
- Grade 1 students have been planting and learning about what plants need to live. They have been observing plan growth at George Lane Park. Because they've just finished their measurement unit, I bet they are putting those skills to good use as they

watch plants grow! They are writing poems about themselves and exploring changes in our world, including in themselves. It was fun to see their stuffies in the Learning Commons this week!

- Grade 2 students are reading like crazy! Their teachers have given them a challenge and they are keen to meet their goal! They are just finishing writing their own poems and will be reading poetry soon. They are also looking at transformations in math (rotations, reflections, slides) through an artistic lens.
- Grade 3 students continue to work on the concept of connection! They are making brochures for countries around the world (Ukraine, Tunisia, and Peru). They also continue to work on both understanding and quick recall of multiplication facts up to 10x10.
- Some of our Grade 4 & 5 students enjoyed being at the Young Authors' conference on Saturday, accompanied by Mrs. Livesey-Moore. It's fun to hear them talk so excitedly about the sessions they attended and how much they learned!
- Grade 4 students are reflecting on whether the form and clarity of their writing and speaking improves their ability to convey meaning... Whoa! In Math, they are looking at how the relationship between addition, subtraction and place value can support their understanding of numbers and how they solve problems. Students are enjoying learning about the connection between living things and continue to talk about how they can minimize any negative impact on living creatures.
- Grade 5 students are getting geared up for their first big school to school transition! This week, the Admin from Senator Riley came over to share some information and take their questions. Some things never change.... Biggest fear: Locks on the lockers! Parent tip: Buy 2 locks this summer to let them practice. When they've got one mastered, switch it out for the 2nd one so they can gain confidence. We will get to see their band play in our gym on May 26th and our students will be walking over for a tour on Mon. June 2nd. Open House for parents and students will be that week on Wed. June 4th from 3:30 to 5:00, with a BBQ first & then a presentation at 4:15 in the Learning Commons.
