In addition to learning about Impulse Control and Response Inhibition, these days at Spitzee...

- We are still humming our Mary Lambert Fire Safety songs...
- K students are talking about what they are grateful for, and learning about letters, sounds, and printing, among other things like lining up & taking turns!
- Grade 1s are mastering short vowel sounds, representing numbers to 10
- Grades 2s are getting close to independently reading for 10 minutes; learning about the concept of "value"; creating an egg landing craft in Science.

- Grade 3s are balancing equations, and asking "In what ways does storytelling help us to understand our traditions?
- Grade 4s and 5s are taking nature walks, reflecting upon their experiences of seasons for science, and looking at how to reduce waste. They are designing the artwork for the mini library outside the school, and talking about leadership in roles such as patrollers, Students Matters reps, and big buddies. Additionally, 5s are working on paragraph writing, looking at the value of digits, and talking about Indigenous Peoples of Canada as they explore our country.
- Grade 5 Leaders are practicing their "Point! Double-check! Proceed" for the SE crosswalk
- Our amazing staff are starting a Book Club with "The Anxious Generation" being the focus.

Our awesome students and staff are also starting up a recycling program with Staples. We will be collecting any whiteboard markers, highlighters, pens etc, that are no longer working, from our classrooms and taking these into Staples Okotoks to be recycled.
