





Internal Resiliency


Perceived ability to resist anxiety and maintain internal emotional and mental balance..

- I don't know who I am as well as I'd like








Safe and Caring




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

Here's the circle graph representing the data you provided:




This pie chart visually breaks down the different strategies people use when they feel they can't do something well. If you need any further analysis or another type of chart, feel free to ask!
