Where did you work before you started at RDL?

I started teaching high school math and physics at Highwood High School, then worked overseas in Macau at a JK-12 international school. After returning to Canada, I taught at Highwood for one more year then became the Vice-Principal at Cayley School. From there I became a Vice-Principal at ESFCHS/AHSFA in Okotoks.

What is a piece of advice that you love to share?

All learners can be successful if they are supported and have loving and caring advocates.

What is your favourite thing about Red Deer Lake?

I love that the school is K-9. This allows for older kids to be role models and leaders for the younger kids. The older dragons are able to support their peers and the younger dragons are able to learn through observation.





What brought you to work in the education field and what do you find most rewarding about your work?

As clichéd as it may sound, I came to education because I love making a positive difference in people's lives. The feeling I get when I see students learning, growing and developing is monumental and profound.

Where did you work before you started at RDL?

I started my career working with Regina Board of Education working in a Structured Learning Classroom (Behaviour needs) and then moved into a Kindergarten position. From there, I moved to southern Saskatchewan and taught Grades 4-6 Fine Arts and French with Weyburn Central School Division. After four years at that magical community, I moved to Calgary and taught at the Calgary Waldorf School for six years teaching Grades 5-9. I made the move to Foothills School Division in 2002. I taught at Ecole Okotoks Junior High School for 13 years teaching Fine Arts (Voice, Drama, Dance) and English and Social Studies 9. Then, I moved to Highwood High School and taught Grade 9-12 Fine Arts (Choral and Drama).

I was fortunate to become the vice-principal of C. Ian McLaren School in Black Diamond the next year and remained in that role for 6 years. In 2020, I became the vice-principal of Red Deer Lake School. And, as Ted Lasso would say, "I feel like I've fallen into the lucky tree and hit every branch on the way down." :)

What is a piece of advice that you love to share?

Oh, goodness, I love to share advice. :) I have a lot of 'Saskatchewanisms' from my dad that I love to share :) I think right now, my most frequent advice reminder is, "Focus on being kind and helpful and everything else will fall into place."


