Hope all is well and you are ready for the 'crisp-ness' of autumn! On a yearly basis, schools in Foothills School Division are required to share with the community how they plan to assess, evaluate, and report student learning in the building.

For the 2023/2024 school year, there are several changes to be aware of, specifically in the domain of reporting student learning:

- On the last day of every month, families will receive an email from Foothills School Division reminding parents to access their child's Edsembli account so that they can keep updated with regards to their child's marks.
- Four times in the school year October 31, December 22, March 28, and May 31 you will receive an additional update regarding your child's progress in their classrooms.
- November 8 and 9 are our dates for Parent Teacher Interviews.
- April 24 and 25 are our dates for Student-Led Conferences where students will coach and lead their parents and/or guardians through their learning.
- On February 16 and June 27 our Learner Profiles will be updated in Edsembli for your viewing pleasure!

The purpose of assessment and reporting is to guide and communicate learning. Procedures used to evaluate student achievement and are designed so that they are:

- fair, just and equitable;
- motivate students;
- instill confidence in students' abilities to learn and to succeed;
- and test a variety of skills and levels of understanding.

General information on assessment, evaluation and reporting of student learning is made available to parents through School Council meetings, Parent/Teacher Conferences/Interviews, Classroom, Curriculum and School Newsletters, Learner Profiles, Social Media platforms, and School/Division websites.

The next two slides are intended to provide families with more information concerning when, how, and why we assess student learning at Red Deer Lake and Foothills School Division.
