#### **Board Strategic Direction:** Stewardship of Resources

In preparation for the implementation of the new curriculum, the Board passed a motion
in support of the recruitment of 12 classroom teachers from Kindergarten to Grade 6 to be
part of a <u>Curriculum Implementation and Design Team</u> that will be tasked with designing
learning and preparing materials and resources for teacher use.

### Ideas that Make Cents Public Consultation

- The purpose of this public engagement is to address our upcoming budgetary needs on two fronts:
  - 1. Find efficiencies to save money/cost reduction
  - 2. Identify new revenue/income opportunities

The information we collect here will help inform the budget we produce in May 2022. The engagement will remain open to all. Submissions will be reviewed as they are submitted.

## **Board Strategic Direction:** Communication and Engagement

- On behalf of the Foothills School Board of Trustees, Trustees Irwin and Evans will be attending the Alberta Rural Education Symposium in March. The theme of the conference is "Flourishing Rural School Communities: Learning and leading through appreciative inquiry".
- Trustees Irwin and Molyneux celebrated the meaningful learning students of Ecole
   Secondaire Highwood High School's Holocaust Studies class shared with them during an exhibition of their final projects.

#### Meeting with Municipal Partners

- Following the Board Meeting on February 9, 2022, the Board of Trustees met with the Town of Okotoks sharing productive conversation about the Municipal Development Plan, work being done on the potential new High School Site, and future collaboration around emergency response planning. The Board also expressed its appreciation to the Town for funding a School Resource Officer Program and for allowing Foothills School Division to give voice to the role the officer will play in FSD schools.
- On March 1, 2022, the Board of Trustees hosted a positive meeting with Foothills
  County with both sides expressing appreciation for the very collaborative and
  solutions-oriented relationship. Discussion throughout the meeting focused on
  potential developments throughout the County, Joint-Use agreements, and Budget

realities - specifically related to FSD's projected \$3.5 million deficit, transportation, and the playground projects in the communities of Blackie and Millarville.

• The Board of Trustees met with MLAs Sigurdson, Reid and Rosin on March 2, 2022, for an action-oriented discussion around several Foothills School Division priorities including establishing a consistent and open line of communication, the Draft K-6 curriculum, the status of FSD's funding request for the Blackie School's playground, as well as budget challenges around transportation and insurance.
