 updated information from families yearly, and this is a mandatory form to complete.
 Mrs. Thorbjornsen has also sent reminders that school fees are to be collected.
 Please read that section carefully for instructions on how to pay school fees.
- **Attendance Letters**. At in-person schools, families receive attendance letters when student attendance shows they have missed 10% or more in a month. At FDS, we measure attendance through student engagement. Please read this section regarding the why and next steps behind these letters.
- **ILPs** we have gone through the Individual Learning Plans for students with an ILP. Please see this section for further details surrounding these documents.

A reminder that school dismisses for the holidays on **Friday, December 22 at 3:15 PM**. Our teachers will be on holiday and will not be available for correspondence during that time. FOOTHILLS High School Course Withdrawal

We are now at the time of year when high school students should be making decisions regarding withdrawal if they need to catch up in their course. Please listen to your teacher's recommendations as they understand what is required to complete a course at the standard they have set out.

Students under 18 years old will need the course withdrawal completed by a parent and sent to Foothills Digital School by email. For our adult students, you must complete the withdrawal form and submit it. Foothills Digital School will only complete a withdrawal from a course with this form. Please use this link: https://forms.office.com/r/7WHeWGbjZU to fill out the form. You will receive an email confirming the withdrawal.

Please reach out to us if you have further questions regarding this. Please note that if a student in high school is in danger of not completing the course, the parent or student needs to take responsibility for the withdrawal to avoid a non-passing grade being placed on transcripts.

Attendance Letters

School attendance is mandatory for students up until the age of 16. Whether students learn in person or in a digital environment like Foothills Digital School, they are expected to engage with their courses and teachers. Students who are not attending school, for different reasons, students are sometimes not present for class meetings (Grades 1-9) or engaging in their courses through completing assignments and submitting work for assessments. When the course teacher has noted a trend, the FDS administration is notified.

The administration will send "attendance letters" to families and students who have not engaged in their courses, along with the next steps that the school may take to assist with attendance and engagement.

Individual Learning Plans (ILPs)

Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) have now been completed for students on those plans. We thank parents of students on ILPs for meeting the parent perspective form. We have also changed many of the strategies on existing ILPs as they were for in-person learning and our digital environment requires different strategy.

Foothills Digital School will email the parents of students who have ILPs this week. We explain the changes to the ILP and instructions on logging in to CLEVR to view, print, and digitally sign the ILP. **As we are a digital school, we do require a digital signature on the ILP**.



Foothills School Division System of Reporting

Starting for the 2023-2024 school year, Foothills School Division will email all families at the end of each month to remind them to check their child's progress in their classes. This is an important piece of our reporting system and ensures we can address student needs well before issuing a Learner Profile (report card). Foothills Digital School has two reporting systems as we have a diverse learning population.

Grades 1-9 students – parents will receive an email each month from Foothills School Division for you to check your child's Edsembli grade books. You will see summative grades (grades applied to the learner profile). Should you wish to have more information regarding teacher feedback on these assignments, please contact your child's teacher, and they can direct you to your child's assignments for feedback.

Grades 10-12 students – our high school teachers use the Moodle Gradebook and Parent Portal to report achievement. Parents should have received an email from Doug Stevens with their login (your email address) and password when the course started. Each month, you will receive an email from Foothills School Division asking you to check your child's progress in Edsembli. **Instead, we ask you to view the Moodle Parent Portal**. You may follow the instructions at this link to view your child's gradebook on the Moodle Parent Portal: FDS Progress Report Email to Parents.docx. This is only for Grades 10-12.



School Fees – PAST DUE

Notices for school fees for the 2023/2024 school year were sent out in September and are now PAST DUE. Payment can be made online via your Edsembli <u>portal</u>, or we accept Cash and Cheque at the school.
