Make our learning meaningful to our lives.

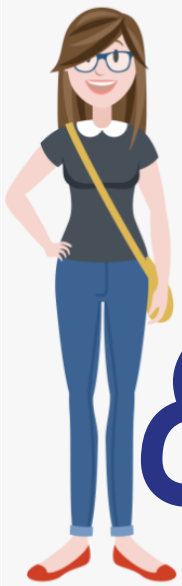
Opportunities to learn about things we are interested in.
