Parent Questions and Wonders

Each month I will share some information about common questions that come our way.

Question: What is an ILP?

Answer: An ILP stands for Inclusive Learning Plan. Some students require a little extra help and support in their learning, or an extra push and enrichment. The ILP is a document that helps capture all the information around the help and supports that a student needs. Teachers build the ILP with families and the Learning Coach, and it is a working document that shifts and change with the child.

ILPs also allow schools to keep track of any diagnosis and medical information so it does not get lost in translation from year to year, or as a child may move schools. Some students may start their school career with an ILP to help support them, and then as they grow and develop, may no longer need one to support their learning. Some students may find that as the grades increase, they need extra support and so an ILP may be suggested later in grades, or even later in the year as teachers get to know their students better.

If your child is diagnosed with a learning disability, a medical condition, or any other information that may impact their learning and/or social interactions, it is important to let their teacher and/or the Learning Coach know. The more we know about a child and how their unique needs impact their learning, the more we can help and support them to flourish into the most amazing version of themselves!
