### **School Bus Safety**



# Please remember these tips so everyone stays safe in and around our buses:

- Unload Students onto the sidewalk or curb not into the road, it is much safer.
- Check for vehicles coming from behind before you open your own driver door. Do not leave your door open to assist students etc. close it as soon as possible.
- Students and parent should never run across the road. Stop on the curb, check both ways and walk across the road if clear.
- Do not park on or close to a pedestrian crossing, you will obscure the view of other drivers of people trying to cross the road. The traffic laws are that you have to park no closer than 5meters (20 feet) from the crosswalk.
- Never pass a vehicle from behind that is stopped at a crosswalk.
- NEVER walk between buses! Always try and cross the road behind the row of buses never in between.
- Always watch for bus movements. Every bus has blind spots please stay away from the buses by at least 3 feet.
- Never run or walk next to a moving bus. You can slip or trip and fall underneath the bus.
- Never pass a moving bus or other vehicle from behind in the school zone. Is it is illegal, you can only pass a bus or other vehicle that is parked in the school zone.
- Avoid at all cost make a U-turn in the school zone.
- Patience, observation and care from everybody involved in the drop-off/pick-up area will result in a safer environment for all.
