Trustee Report – John Evans

- FSD chosen to have UofC Psychology students intern within schools
- Foothills Communities Flourishing Award to be open for nominations on website shortly
- Budget released last week
 - Increase in transportation funding
 - Decrease in distance to school to be eligible for bus funding, potentially need more routes and drivers to accommodate this
- Footnotes printout handed out

- Kindergarten screening March 29
- Student numbers update
 - Since Chase has been at Blackie school, student numbers have increased from 99 to 129 kids
 - Upper two classes projected to be sizable next year
 - Need to be mindful of physical space within the school
 - Potential for room being used as CTS space/before and after school care right now to be moved into current JK room, freeing up that larger class room for the large 7/8 class next year

- Easter break is two weeks this year
 - Mixed reception, hard for working parents, this taken into consideration in next year's calendar

- Further follow up needed with FSD communication

Other new business brought forward

- (Yvonne) Discussion about plans for band program next year
 - Band not popular with some students, some students pretending to be sick to get out of band, etc

- Question about possibility of allowing other instruments to be played
 - Chase: school policies say instruments need to be brass or woodwind (no guitars, etc)
- Admin and band teacher feel like the negativity towards the band program at Blackie School is a cultural issue within this school being passed down from older students
 - Chase has had discussions with admin at Cayley School with same program, same music, same band teacher who hasn't had the same issues at Cayley
 - The feeling is that younger grades at the school generally are more positive about the program than grade 7/8s right now and they are hoping the culture slowly changes over the next few years as those students move up
- Suggestion about not being so strict about instrument numbers and ratios to allow more students to play their instrument of first choice instead of being forced to play another
- Suggestion about focussing on making band class more fun for students right now in order to gain the developmental benefits of music/band at this age level and focussing less on developing technically strong future musicians due to the fact that most of the kids will not continue on in band
