Key points include:

New High School for Okotoks: FSD received design funding for a new high school, with Alberta Infrastructure leading the design. The Board is preparing for construction funding approval.

**Community Involvement**: The community is encouraged to advocate for construction funding by contacting local high-influence decision-makers. FSD will gather feedback through surveys and events to inform the design, programming, and naming of the new facility.

**Evidence-Informed Decisions**: Parents and guardians are active partners in their child's education. The regular reminders to check gradebooks has increased engagement on Edsembli.

Assurance surveys and other data collection methods help FSD make informed decisions.

**School Councils**: These councils play a crucial role in school success by informing improvement planning and enhancing student learning and engagement.

## FSD Partnership: The Foothills Community Coalition is seeking members for the Youth Advisory Committee

The Foothills Community Coalition is looking for 20 youth who are between 15 to 18 years who live, work, study or play in the region of the Foothills to be involved on the Youth Advisory Committee.

### **Purpose:**

The purpose of the Youth Advisory Committee is to be the voice of young people by providing advice and feedback related to the planning, design, and building of an Integrated Youth Hub.

### **Youth Advisory Committee Commitment:**

- Commit for a minimum period of 1 year with the option to participate until project completion estimated 36 48 months.
- 6-8 meetings annually, to be held in person on weekday evenings.
- The first meeting will be held mid December 2024.
