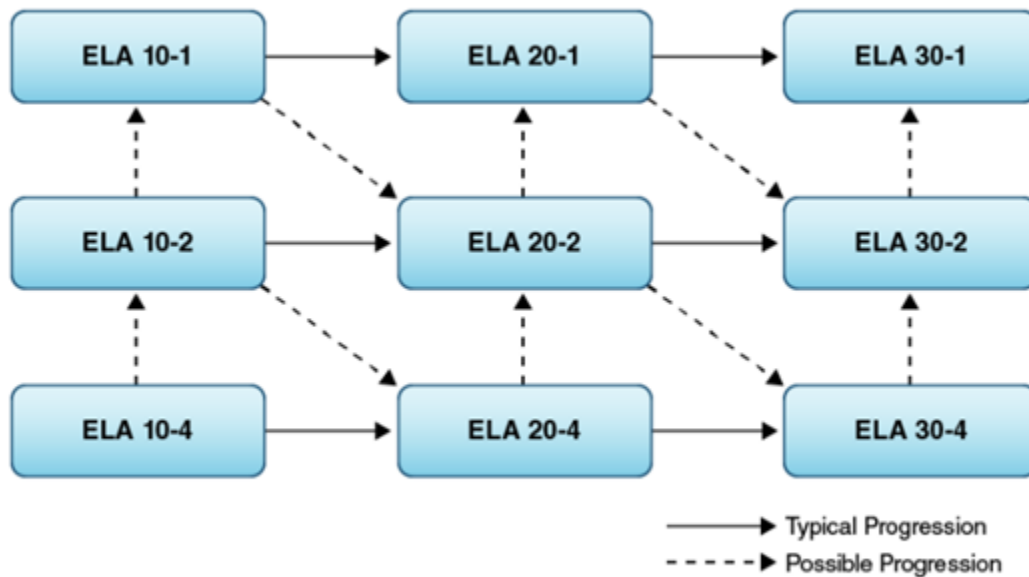


## High School Course Sequencing Charts

In senior high school, provincially developed programs are designed to accommodate transfer between course sequences at particular points. Students generally take the prerequisite in a course sequence (for e.g., English Language Arts 10-1, 20-1, 30-1). This route is designated by solid arrows. Alberta Education recognizes that students may transfer between course sequences and these possible routes are designated by broken arrows. Special circumstances may warrant student transfer at other points. Pre-requisite courses must be passed in order to move into the next grade level course.

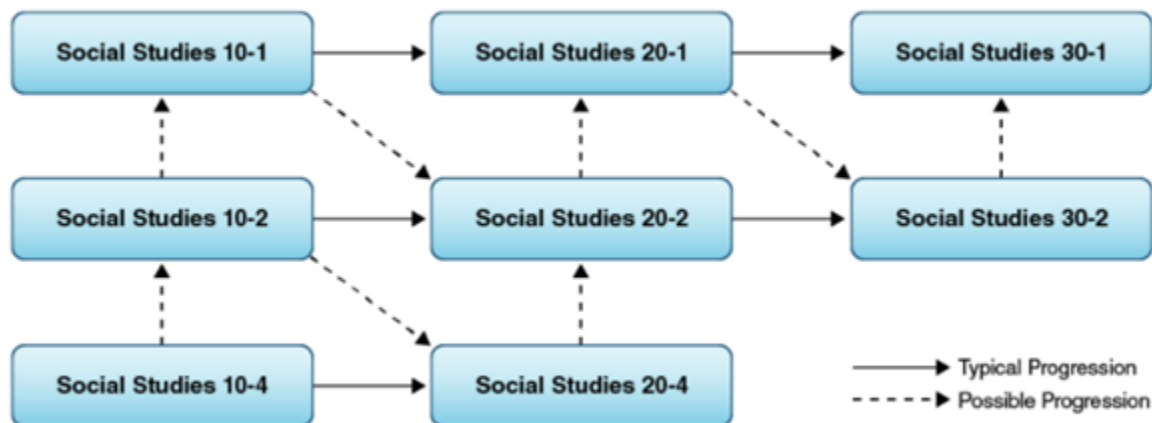
The possible transfer points are as follows: (Note: -4 stream is K&E Programming and requires specialized meetings for registration)

### English Language Arts (ELA) Program



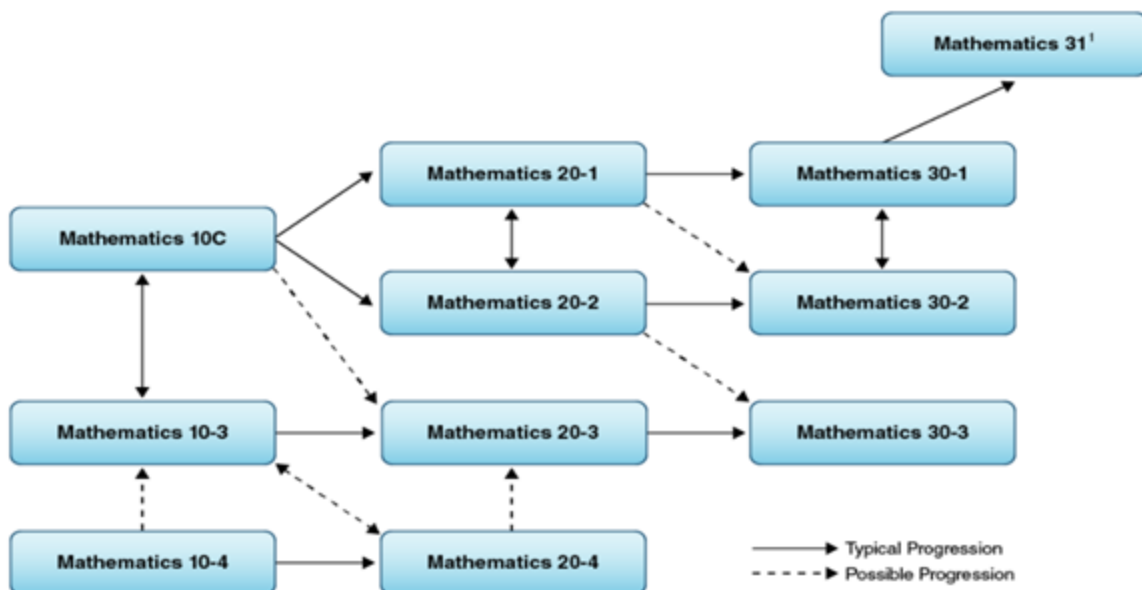
(Each course is 5 credits.)

(Each course is 5 credits.)

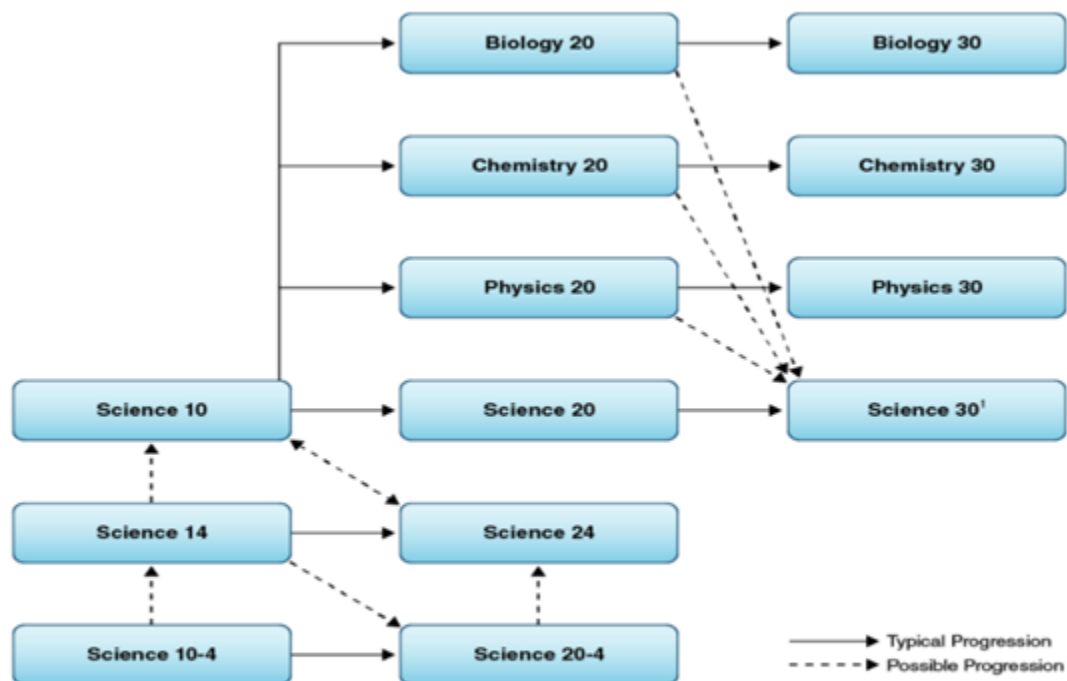
# Mathematics Program
