Before enrolling in the program, most students had little to no knowledge of vertical farming. By the end of the semester, they are confident in their ability to educate others on the principles of sustainable agriculture. Students host informational tours, providing insights into the program's carbon footprint and the concept of Net Zero Operations. This initiative has proven to be an innovative and

transformative educational opportunity, equipping students with knowledge and skills that are applicable in both academic and real-world contexts. The program actively engages students and the public, ensuring they are equipped with the tools to make informed environmental decisions and contribute to a sustainable future.

Inspired by the Indigenous principle of "the seven generations," the VFI incorporates responsible land and resource management practices to ensure long-term sustainability. One of the major challenges students have tackled is mitigating crop loss due to pests, a common issue in agricultural production. By implementing a biosecurity header house, they have successfully reduced waste while improving overall productivity. The initiative also promotes sustainability by reducing food waste and enhancing the efficiency of the local food supply chain. Furthermore, the local impact of this initiative extends beyond the school. The fresh produce grown in Diamond Valley is now being supplied to local grocery stores, reducing reliance on externally sourced produce and subsequently lowering transportation and energy costs.

The Vertical Farm Initiative at Oilfields High School exemplifies the values of the Alberta Emerald Foundation Grant by promoting environmental awareness, fostering innovative problem-solving, and making a meaningful contribution to the local community. By engaging students, educators, and the public, this initiative ensures that environmental excellence is celebrated, sustained, and shared for generations to come.
