


## Digging Deep to Develop Student Learning A Professional Development Bulletin designed to communicate growth in instructional practice and learning.



## **Harvard Fever!**


This fall six more OHS teachers completed Harvard's Visible
Thinking Routine course. "Thinking
Routines loosely guide learners'
thought processes and encourage active processing. They are short, easy-to-learn mini-strategies that extend and deepen students'
thinking and become part of the fabric of everyday classroom life." In February, even more OHS teachers will be enrolled in the course. Be

sure to ask your child about how they're using Visible Thinking Routines to deepen their learning. They may mention: See Think Wonder, Headlines, Chalk Talk, 3-2-1 Bridge, etc. Learning is the goal for all assignments; therefore, a great question to ask your child is "what do you think the teacher wants you to learn by using that routine/thinking process?"

Oilfields' administration and four teachers will be taking another Harvard course, **Cultures of Thinking**, which builds upon the learning from **Visible Thinking Routines**. This course focuses on "building dynamic learning communities that engage students, promote deep understanding, and sustain a lifetime of inquiry. Culture matters not only to realize curricular goals, but also as a shaper of students' development powerful thinkers and learners." In this course, staff will study and learn to implement the eight forces to build a strong, group, learning culture.
