



What is MyPass?



- 1. MyPass is essential for:
 - Viewing Diploma Results
 - Ordering transcripts (D.A.R) for now and future!
 - Requesting & Paying for Diploma rewrites
- 2. Go to the Counsellor Corner website and download the instructions **OR there are also QR codes posted around the school** that will link you to these instructions!

**Use a PERSONAL email address. Gmail tends to work best







myPass is an Alberta Education self-service website for students to:

- Order high school transcripts in English and French
- View diploma exam marks
- Register to write or rewrite diploma exams with online payment
- View and print Detailed Academic Reports (DAR)
- View progress towards a credential (diploma or certificate)
- Order additional copies of an awarded credential in English or French
- Receive notifications for important messages





Surveys — What should I do for a living?


On the left menu click on Who am I? – Free personality and career surveys!




Finding Post-Secondary Options

- 1. Click on **Post-Secondary** tab
- 2. Choose Apprenticeship, College & University or Workplace
- 3. Enter **Keyword** (science, theatre, dance, history)
- 4. Narrow your search for **Province/Cities** you're interested in
- 5. All the information about **tuition**, **entrance requirements** and any **additional information** is there!
- 6. Application link is directly under admissions requirements
- *** If any of the admission requirements is not checked off
- that means your child is missing an entrance requirement***

If there is an x on the requirement – then you don't have the requirements for that program!

What myBlueprint is NOT good for...

- Do NOT use myBlueprint for your official credit count!
 - USE MYPASS!!!
- Do NOT use myBlueprint for the Rutherford scholarship! It doesn't always calculate it correctly
 - you will use the Alberta Student Aid website for this

Ready to apply within Alberta? apply within Alberta?

Here is the Process!

- 1. Visit ApplyAlberta.ca
- The creation of your ApplyAlberta account, can be used to apply to **ALL Alberta** colleges and universities
- 3. You will need your **9-digit Alberta Education Number**
- Reminder: **DO NOT USE** school g-mail for **ANYTHING** linked to post-secondary. Students lose their Gmail account when they graduate.

Entering Your Courses and Grades into ApplyAlberta



- 5. Universities will use your grade 11 grades (as these are finalized). You will need to "self report" or guess your grade 12 grades while creating your ApplyAlberta account.
- 6. Start with your grade 12 courses that you are going to take in
 - Click on "Planned"
 - Add your current grade 12 courses
 - Click "In Progress"
 - Add every grade 11 course you have completed
 - Click: "Completed" and put in your final mark
 - Keep adding your grade 11 courses until you run out of space.

**Note: CTS modules that begin with a 2 and 3, all need to be added individually.

Enter as much of the module title as possible when entering.

7. In early **February and early July**, colleges and universities in Alberta, will **pull your marks automatically from Alberta Education** – SO NO NEED TO REQUEST YOUR TRANSCRIPTS!

Ready to apply OUTSIDE Alberta?

Here is the Process!

1. Each university/province has different programs for applications.

Example: Ontario has its own 'Commonapp' much like ApplyAlberta.

- 2. Click on the "Apply" link in MyBlueprint to be directed to the post-secondary institution's application process.
- 3. You can send your "unofficial" transcripts by downloading a D.A.R.

 (Detailed Academic Report) from your MyPass account and send it via e-mail to admissions.

Ready to apply OUTSIDE Alberta? The Process Continued...

- 4. For **official transcripts**, you will need to request a copy to be sent to each post-secondary institution from your **MyPass account**
 - Electronic transcripts are \$10/copy -
 - you will need to send these in early February AND early July.



5. One application fee (for many universities), allows you to apply for **multiple programs** in that university.




Do you want to study in the USA?

- 1. Go to the **college/university** of choice and search "international student" in their search bar.
- 2. You can send a "Request for Information." They will connect you with a recruiter who will answer all your questions about SAT's/ACT's entrance requirements, dates etc.

- an entrance exam.
- completed training,
- currently enrolled,
- from another province, and
- working in trade but not as an apprentice.



What kinds of marks do I need to get in?

- Some universities advertise their "projected entrance average."
- Most universities will not publish their actual projected entrance average-- So aim 5-10% higher than advertised!
- If you do not meet the entrance requirements, try some college-university transfer routes that are **NON-COMPETITIVE** based.
- Which means they accept the first qualified students first rather than waiting and picking the top students.
- We have a list of Alberta colleges and universities that have noncompetitive entrance programs.

So, as a back-up, apply to a few smaller universities and/or colleges as well as your top choice just in case!

Rutherford Scholarship

To recognize and reward academic achievement at the senior high school level and to encourage students to pursue post-secondary studies.

Value:Up to \$2,500

Eligibility: To receive this scholarship, you must meet all of these eligibility criteria:

- Be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Be an Alberta resident
- You or your parent(s) must have resided in Alberta during the qualifying grade(s).
- Be enrolled in 60% of a full course load in a post-secondary program of at least one semester in length, or an apprenticeship program.

*** You will still receive your cheque even if you attend postsecondary education outside of Alberta.










Grade 12 To Do List

- 1) **Look** at Post-Secondary schools of your choice and register on-line for Open Houses.
- 2) **Contact/Find** an Academic Advisor/Recruitment officer at the post-secondary institution and ask direct questions about requirements and programs.
- 3) Activate MyPass & ApplyAlberta
- 4) **Apply** to schools that have early admission
- 5) **Look** and **prepare** for scholarships that you are going to apply for.
